

# **Glenville State College Faculty Senate Minutes**

August 18, 2009

## **I. Call to Order and Roll**

President Dennis Wemm called to order the Glenville State College Faculty Senate at 12:20 p.m. on August 18, 2009 in the Mollohan Center Conference Room, Room 319.

## **II. Approval of Minutes and Ongoing Reports**

**Motion to approve minutes of April 21, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.** Motion passed and minutes approved.

### **Reports:**

Dennis Wemm (President's Report):

- Wemm requests a motion to approve proposed faculty committee assignments (see appendix). Faculty who are not assigned to a committee will work for committees for the Provost. Motion passed. (Baker/Minton m/s)
- Larry Baker is nominated as the new Vice President of the Senate. Elected by acclamation. (O'Dell, Sawyer m/s)

Paul Peck (ACF and Board of Governors Representative Report):

- Paul attended June 26<sup>th</sup> ACF meeting. (See Appendix.)
- Issues raised at the June 26<sup>th</sup> meeting: the elimination of the Praxis II test.
- Connie Stout states the WV standards are changing. She attended a meeting called Tomorrow's Teacher A New Vision for Preparation and it was sponsored by the West Virginia Department of Education. The meeting was to discuss and share the newly created West Virginia Professional Teaching Standards.
- Larry Baker states that the elimination could be an issue because the National Board for Certification is aligned with the Praxis test.
- Echard asks who has been appointed to the board of governors?
- Kathy Butler states there have only been nominations, no appointments yet.

## **III. Unfinished Business:**

### **Student Housing Policy:**

- Wemm offers three possible actions: 1. Leave the issue on the table. 2. Reject it 3. Or approve the proposal and send it on to College Leadership Council.
- Walborn requests we discuss the issue.
- 5 Senators abstained because of lack of info regarding the issue. The issue is left on the table for lack of a majority.

### **FRM Calendar Issues:**

- Wemm asks the Senate for volunteers to form an Ad Hoc Committee to reconcile the recommended revised policy to state law requiring March 1 notice for all non-renewed faculty.
- Wemm, Peck and O'Dell volunteer.

## **III. New Business:**

### **New Seat for Criminal Justice:**

- Senate needs to approve a seat for the new Criminal Justice Department on campus.
- Paul Peck moves to amend Section 1 of the Faculty Senate Constitution to include the Department of Criminal Justice; and to seat a representative to the new Department on the Faculty Senate. (O'Dell, Peck m/s)  
Motion passed

### **Identification of Alternate ACF Representative**

- Jonathan Minton has been voted as the Alternate Representative by the faculty. The Senate approves the vote. (Baker/Sawyer m/s)

### **Orange Suited Men on Campus:**

- Batson states that is very disturbing to see people from the prison on campus doing lawn work. He also asks if they are taking state jobs?
- DeMatteo states he is also concerned about the state jobs.
- Peck is concerned about the student jobs.
- Kathy Butler states that GSC is short of help because of the Morris Criminal Justice Training Center. The prisoners were also here last year.

### **Student Privacy Issue:**

- Batson states that not being able to close the door of your office when talking to a student could infringe on student privacy.

### **Tuition Waiver Policy:**

- Walborn requests the Senate discuss this tuition waiver policy next time. This is a great incentive for incoming faculty.

**Great Teacher Seminar:**

- Walborn would like to discuss the Seminar's progress. He would hate to see it go.
- Discussion of support and the past difficulties in scheduling and securing representation from all colleges ensued.
