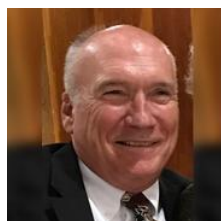

Alumni Spotlight

Richard R. Messenger '69 was inducted into the USATF National Officials Committee's Hall of Fame on December 1, 2017, in Columbus Ohio. He was one of four officials presented in the class of 2017.

Richard is a retired educator from Lewis County, WV where he served as a teacher, coach, athletic director and principal for 36 years. He has also served as a collegiate and high school football official as well as a high school basketball official.

Messenger completed a four year term as a member of the National Federation High School Track and Field Rules Committee in June 2017 and has served as the Rules Interpreter for Track and Field for the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission since 2002. He served his 49th year as an official for the West Virginia State High School Track and Field Championships in May 2017 where he also serves as the Meet Director.

Richard has served as the Chief Implement Inspector for the last three Olympic Trials as well as the last eight USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. He has also been selected to be the Chief Implement Inspector for the 2018 USA Outdoor Championships. Messenger has served as an official at 29 USATF National Youth Championships in a variety of positions which includes Implement

Richard is married to the former Donna Zirgibel who is also a USATF track and field official. They work as track and field officials at meets around the country from early January through August each year.
