Matt Cogar '10 has won his unprecedented fifth straight Stihl Timbersports United States Professional Championship Series. The competition took place in July 2017 in front of more than 5,000 fans of the sport at BMO Harris Pavilion, German Fest Milwaukee in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and was aired on ABC on October 8, 15, and 22, 2017. The series, which has been around for over thirty years, assembles the world's top lumberjack athletes to vie in a variety of competitions based on mastery of traditional logging skills.

The U.S. Championship win propelled Cogar, who has turned professional, to represent the United States at the World Championship, which was held in Lillehammer, Norway in November 2017. Cogar, who is one of the best lumberjack athletes in the world, came in fourth in this competition after placing second the year before.

Cogar and his wife, Emma (Bailey) Cogar '10 reside in Taylor County with their young daughter. In a typical year, he will travel to 15 competitions in the United States and another five or six abroad. Emma
