Biographical Note: Clark, Robert, (1885-1972), educator

Robert Clark was born on September 26, 1885 in Hemlock, Upshur County, WV. The first school which Robert taught at was a one-room Parting Springs School in the Middle Fork District of Randolph County in 1904, when he was 19 years old. At this small school, which was 3 miles from the family farm, Robert taught is younger brother, Humboldt Yokum Clark, which was only 4 years younger than he.

Between 1905 and 1908, Robert attended the West Virginia Wesleyan Academy and passed his high school and college preparatory courses. From 1908 to 1912, Robert pursued his B. S. degree and obtained it from the West Virginia Wesleyan College. During his time at Wesleyan, he excelled in Chemistry, Math, and Grammar. He also participated in other extracurricular activities, which included the student newspaper, The Pharos. During his senior year, he was editor-in-chief of the paper. Robert later obtained his Masters Degree from the George Peabody College of Nashville, TN.

He went on to marry Myrtle Bond and had three children, Roberta in 1919, Richard in 1920, and Jo Anne in 1926. Robert, as well as his brother Humboldt, became very successful in the education field in West Virginia. Robert was responsible for many of the standards that came about because of the growth associated with the public school

system as his time as an administrator. By 1925, Robert had become the State Supervisor of Teacher Training. He would later hold positions as the President of the West Virginia State Education Association and also became the Assistant Superintendant of Monongalia County Schools.

Robert strove to find a rational medium ground in the highly debated "subject matter centered" and "child centered" teaching methods that were being explored in his time. He also held much importance in Parent/Teacher Associations, adequate transportation to and from schools, and the financial obligations of the state in regards to individual county's needs. Robert spent his career attempting to improve West Virginia's education system and was very instrumental in its early beginnings. He passed away on April 7, 1972.
