### Police Seminar To Be Held

Have you ever thought of being in police work? GSC will hold a seminar for all those interested on November 29, 1984, from 9:45 a.m. until 3:45 p.m.

There are ways which may be taken by the officer to minimize damages of liability when handling investigations and prosecutions so that he does not overstep boundaries of the law.

Practical samples, discussions, and lectures will be presented as well as standards of conduct and new trends in liability.

Copies of statutes and new interpretations will be given to each

participant. The officer will then have a full review and update on what he may or may not do in the performance of his duties.

The seminar will be held in the Vandalia Room of the Pioneer Center and will include discussions of civil vs. criminal proceedings, use of deadly force, negligent selection, training, and retraining officers, failure to protect, rape on campus and jail suicides.

The Training Institute program has been approved by the Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency, and Corrections for certification under the Law

Enforcement Training Act for meeting 5 hours of the annual 8 hour requirement.

Darrell W. Ringer, J. D. an attorney from Morgantown, WV, will direct the program.

The registration fee is \$20.00 and includes all activities, materials, coffee breaks, and lunch in the Verona Mapel Room. Pre-registration is requested.

### Proficiency Exam Announced

The English Proficiency Examination will be given in Room 312AB, Monday, December 10, 1984, at 6:00 p.m. Students who have completed 58 semester hours, or will have completed this number by the end of the semester, and who have not achieved an overall average of 2.0 (C) or better in English 101 and 102, should come to the Language Division Office and register to take the test. Anyone who was enrolled at GSC prior to the fall

semester 1977 must include his English 202 grade in deciding whether he has achieved the required "C" average.

If a student has made a "D" or "F" in English 101 or 102, then rather than take the examination, he may repeat the course(s) one time only to achieve a "C" average or better. Students who are enrolled in certain two-year programs and pre-professional programs do not have to meet requirements that include this test.

### Julian Elected Chairperson

Charles A. Julian, Public Services Librarian and Instructor of Library Science at Glenville State College, was recently elected Chairperson of the West Virginia Library Association's College and University Section. The results of the balloting were announced by Charles E. McMorran, President at the Association's annual meeting held at Harper's Ferry.

Julian joined the staff of the Robert F. Kidd Library in 1980. Since that time he has served as Media Librarian, Reference Librarian and Public Services in addition to teaching undergraduate library science classes. Previous offices held in the West Virginia Library Association include Chairperson of the Junior Members Round Table, Secretary of the College and University Section, and Second Vice-President of the Association. 
been a regular contributor to **West Virginia Libraries** and for several years has compiled the West Virginia state report for the American Library Association's **Yearbook of Library and Information Services**.

Julian received his A.B. in Education from Glenville State College in 1975, a Master's in Information Studies from the University of Sheffield, England in 1978, and a Masters in Library Science from George Peabody College for Teachers in 1979. Currently he is a candidate for the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Library Science from the Florida State University.

When contacted about the appointment Julian noted, "I am certain that considering the plethora of talent available in the College and University Section that the year will be a fruitful and productive one."

Please note that these are a few of the conflicts that I noticed and I am sure that they have presented a problem to some students, but not to all.

Nevertheless, pre-registration is occurring the remainder of the week and it is a busy and hassle-filled week for all, especially those that have to deal with the conflicts.

# Lady Pioneers To Open Season Friday In Tourney

The Lady Pioneers will open their season at Johnstown, PA, Friday in the University of Pitt-Johnstown Invitational Tournament.

The ladies will face tough competition in the first round of the tournament in the form of Allegheny College of Meadville, PA. Allegheny posted a 21-4 record last season and is returning all of last year's players. Other teams in the tournament are Pitt-Johnstown and St. Francis of Lorretto, PA.

Glenville, who played well in a scrimmage

against Carnegie-Mellon according to head coach Tim Carney, will feature the talents of senior co-captains Kim Maynard and Maria Lothes. Maynard is a 5' 10" forward from Lavalette, WV, and Lothes is a 5' 11" forward from Elkins. The only other senior on the squad is 5' 2" guard Cathy Starcher from Walton, WV.

Juniors on the team are six-foot center Janice Hensley and 5' 7" Tina Burkhamer, who will see action in both the guard and forward spots. Kathy Knapp, a 5' 10" forward, and Marsha

Shrader, a 5' 8" forward, are the team's two sophomores.

Three freshmen will be joining the Lady Pioneers this year. They are 5' 5" guard Beth Kraus, 5' 9" forward Rhonda Hicks, and 5' 11" forward Tammy Cole.

The Ladies' first home game will be a 7:00 p.m. tilt against West Virginia Tech on Thursday, December 6. Coach Carney also announced an addition to the schedule which will include games on Dec. 7 and 8 in the Potomac State Invitational.

## Basketball Squad Tops AAU Team

Rudy Watts burned the nets for 22 points and Steve Linville and Matthew Bullett added 16 each to lead the Pioneer basketball team to a 102-78 victory in a scrimmage game held Wednesday, November 14, against the Sports-men's Club.

Glenville was 20 of 36 from the floor for 56.6% and five of eight from the free thrown line in the first half. Their AAU affiliated opponent was only 50% from both the floor and the line, as GSC held a 45-39 lead at halftime.

In the second half, the Pioneers hit 62.8% of their field goal tries and 66.7% from the charity stripe, to finish the game shooting almost 60% from the floor while hitting 63% from the foul line.

Linville led GSC in rebounds with 18, 13 on the offensive boards, while Watts pulled in 11. Kenny Taylor had six caroms and added 13 points, and Richard Moore scored 10 points and dished out five assists.

Other Pioneer scorers were Steve Morris with seven, Kenny Prettyman

with six, Steve Davis and John Harris with four each, followed by Ray Mullins with four and Bryan Johnson with one point.

Information on last night's season opener with West Virginia State

was not available at presstime. The Pioneers' next game will be November 30 in Phillippi when they will participate in the Alderson-Broadus Invitational Tournament.
